Bushfire Season

Issue 12

Term 4 signals the beginning of bushfire season. The need for us to have a Bushfire Action Plan as part of our Emergency Management plan (EMP) is in place due to our high risk rating. This is reviewed annually with updated information communicated via the newsletter.

The EMP encompasses a range of strategies and responsibilities in preparation for bushfire season:

- A plan of action in the event of a fire on site or in the immediate vicinity to our school.
- School response to a 'Total Fire Ban day'.
- School response to a fire reported within the local district.

It is essential that all members of the school community are familiar with our Bushfire Action Plan. Throughout terms 1 & 4 of each year information from our EMP will be communicated via our newsletter as a reminder of our responsibilities in ensuring everyone's safety during Bushfire Season.

The following information indicates the action taken to-date as a school in preparing our site for Bushfire Season.

- An Emergency Response team has been established
- Emergency drills have been carried out by staff with students.

Nature Play & Curiosity

Students access our new Nature Play area during class/yard time and whilst attending Out of School Hours Care program, promoting learning through interaction with the Natural Environment and a 'Curiosity for learning'.

As educators, we have devised a clear set of expectations when accessing this space which differs from our general learning and play expectations. For example, students are encouraged to use materials from the natural environment (sticks and stones) in a safe manner when creating and constructing and have permission to climb trees.

Please take the time to familiarise yourselves with the Nature Play guidelines on the following page and discuss these with your children on a regular basis.

We must understand this learning environment encourages risk taking, problem solving, curiosity and collaboration with our peers and wish to reassure you we have undertaken the necessary risk assessments to maintain a safe learning environment at all times under direct staff supervision.

Smoke Free Zone

Parent/Carers are reminded that the entire school grounds are smoke free zones at all times. This includes families using the OSHC service.

- All staff are familiar with our EMP and their responsibilities.
- Administration staff have received training in the operation of sprinkler and water systems.
- Administration staff monitor ABC radio 891 AM for bushfire information.
- All trees have been trimmed and gutters cleaned.
- Timber and paintwork is well maintained.
- The gymnasium has been identified as our Bushfire Refuge Area in the event of a fire.
- A Bushfire Ready Kit of emergency supplies is kept.
- Student and staff medications have been listed and can be easily transported to the Bushfire Refuge area in the Gym.
- Student rolls and staff/visitor registers are to be taken to the Bushfire Ready area in event of fire.

Nature Play Guidelines

Nature Play Rules / Guidelines

- Cover the pointy end and drag big sticks.
- Sticks and rocks must be carried and not thrown or used as weapons.
- Use water wisely- no splashing others.
- Rocks are not to be put in trees.
- All materials are to be shared (this includes rocks and sticks).
- Be aware of people around you when building.
- Make constructions in a safe way.
- Cooperate and solve problems.
- Collect materials and build in Nature Play space only.
- Only trees clearly identified are to be climbed. Trees will have markings to show how high you are able to climb.
- No eating in the Nature Play space (there is a table on the top grass area).

Preschool to School Transition 2020

At Gulfview Heights we create a place where all children feel safe, healthy and happy, and where they get the best chance to become confident and successful learners.

The transitions children make within and between educational settings (from preschool/kindy to school) are recognised as significant to the achievement of these goals. Successful experiences during transition impact on a child's positive sense of belonging, ongoing well being and continuity of learning.

For these reasons, we are supporting all children and families in the Salisbury cluster of schools by having the 'One Start, One Transition' program for all children starting preschool and school in 2020.

Dear Parent,

Parents are welcome to watch their children at the Aquadome DECD swimming program. As an observer entry to watch is free, but you <u>must</u> enter via the main doors. Whilst at the pool please adhere to the Aquadome and DECD policies.

Students do not have access to the pool outside of their lesson time and we ask that you do not allow them in the pool except with their instructor and they must vacate the pool immediately after their lesson has finished.

Parents and siblings of students are not allowed to use the pool whilst the DECD program is operating, (unless as a paid patron of the pool and in the designated casual swimming areas).

Change rooms are provided and the changing of students on poolside is strictly prohibited.

As per Department of Education Swimming and Aquatics flyer re 'Role of Parents';

The DECD swimming and Aquatics program is a curriculum based program and as such the direct relationship is between the instructors and the school.

Where a parent attends in a private capacity they can assist the instructors by observing the following guidelines.

- Parents are asked not to communicate with the Instructor or any child during the lesson. Direct communication in this way does distract and can impact on the safety of the class.
- Parents to contact the school, or school representative on site, if they require any
 further information about the program or their child's involvement in the program.

Any parent wishing to use a camera in the facility needs to;

- Get approval from the School / Teachers.
- Read and adhere to the YMCA policy, sign at reception and wear the sticker prior to taking photos. Please do not take photos of the instructors unless you have their permission.
- Only take photos of your own child.
- The Aquadome has a strict 'NO VIDEO CAMERA Policy'.
