School Fees

Late last year Governing Council polled the school community to alter the standard sum of materials and services charges per student. After a favourable poll and the approval of the Governing Council the legally recoverable school fees for 2022 have been maintained at \$350 per student. This does not include individual class excursions, swimming lessons etc. Invoices will be forwarded to families from next week and we have EFTPOS available to assist with payment of fees through the front office as well as Qkr and bank transfer payment options. We are in the process of setting up payment options for school fees and uniform orders through the Qkr app and the school community will be notified when this is available.

Unless an instalment plan has been negotiated with the Finance Officer, all Materials and Services charges need to be paid in full by the end of Term 1 in line with our school Debt Collection Policy.

Community Safety

In the interest of student safety, parents are reminded that pedestrian access to and from classrooms is via the pedestrian access gates and walk ways only. Under no circumstances should students or families be walking through the car park to access the school.

Families are also asked to refrain from gathering on the decking area outside the new classrooms at pick up time as this creates safety issues due to congestion, along with disrupting classroom procedures at the end of the day.

Managing COVID-19 Cases

Families are reminded that if your child develops Covid-19 symptoms such as a fever, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath, runny nose, loss of smell/taste, muscle/joint pains, diarrhoea, nausea/vomiting or extreme tiredness, they should immediately obtain a PCR test, inform Gulfview Heights Primary School and stay at home until you receive confirmation of a negative test and their symptoms have resolved, whichever is longer.

If your child tests positive, s/he is a COVID-19 case, must remain isolated for 10 days and must follow SA Health instructions.

Updating Emergency Contacts

Please ensure that all emergency contact details are kept up to date via the front office. This can be done via email, a note **in your child's communication book (marked attention admin)** or in person. It is important to remember that anyone picking up children outside of the normal finishing time must be listed as an emergency contact or the student will be required to remain at school until the parent/caregiver can be contacted.

COVID Safe Community Assemblies

Community Assemblies will resume in the coming weeks and are a great way for students to develop a range of skills by organising and hosting the events. Students take enormous pride in showcasing their work and sharing aspects of school life with their families and members of our community. Your child's class teacher will inform you when their class will be hosting so that families of hosting students ONLY can attend. This will enable us to manage physical distancing protocols.



Sun Safety

In accordance with our Sunsmart Policy all classes have been provided with sunscreen. Students are expected to apply and re-apply sunscreen when participating in outdoor activities. Students who may have reactions to some brands of sunscreens are expected to have their own. A reminder that all students are expected to **wear their hats in term 1,3 and 4** when outdoors, and throughout the year for excursions and extended periods of outdoor lessons.



Carpark Safety

In the interests of student safety we are reminding all members of our community that the staff carpark area is NOT to be used as a drop off and pick up zone at all times. Parents/carers accessing OSHC will need to use street parking and the pedestrian gates to access the service. Parents/Carers are asked to discuss alternative drop off/pick up arrangements using the street parking available with their children. The carpark area will be accessible during all other school hours for parents/carers dropping off students late or picking them up early.

Parents/Carers are asked to support this practice immediately to ensure the safety of all children at all times. Disability parking is available at all times for permit holders. Please see the front office with proof of disability permit to obtain an access code. These codes are to be used by the disabled permit holders only.

The 'Kiss n Drop' Zone at the front of the school operates during the hours of 8:30 to 9:00am and 3:00 to 3:30pm and is designed as a 'free flowing' pick up/drop off point for students i.e. driver must remain in the car at all times (no parking) with a maximum 2-3 minute time limit, allowing other drivers the opportunity to access this service.



You can install the app on your phone or tablet device by following these instructions:



For iPhone and iPad users:

1. Click the "App Store" icon on your Apple device.
2. Type your school name in the search, using suburb name will help.
3. If iPhone, you will see your school appear, click "Free" then "Install".
4. If iPad, change the drop list to "iPhone Apps", your school will then be visible, click "Free" then "Install".
5. When installed click "Open"
6. Select "OK" to receive push notifications, when asked.
7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you.



For Android users:

You must first have signed up with a Google Account before installing the app.

1. Click the "Play Store" button on your Android Device
2. Click the magnifying glass icon at the top and type in your school name, using suburb name will help.
3. Click the school name when it appears in the search.
4. Click the "Install" button.
5. Click "Accept" for various permissions (please note, we do not modify any of your personal data on your device).
6. Click "Open" when installed.
7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you

Parking Around Schools

Due to the chaotic nature of traffic around schools at peak times, streets can be an extremely dangerous place for children.

Young children have not yet fully developed their cognitive abilities and therefore their perception, judgement and awareness of potentially dangerous situations is not adequately developed to enable them to cope with the road traffic.

Children are not easily visible and often act impulsively, which means if you are driving around a school take special care, to ensure we keep our children safe. Remember that children copy grown-ups - encourage good road sense by watching them closely and leading by example.

5 Helpful Tips for School Zones

As parents and caregivers we have a great responsibility to ensure children stay safe in school zones. We also play a key role in educating children about road safety. Here are 5 helpful tips for safety in school zones:-

1. Allow enough time to take your child to the school gate safely and without rushing.
2. Always observe parking signs and speed limits in and around school zones. They are designed to keep your child safe.
3. Talk about signs and traffic lights with your child. Identify and discuss places where it is safe to get out of the car and cross the road.
4. Teach your child how to cross the road using the 'stop, look and listen' process - stop at the kerb, look and listen for traffic and then decide whether it is safe to cross.
5. Park a few streets away and walk your child to school. This is also good exercise and helps teach your child road safety rules.

Behaviours to Avoid

- Speeding
- Double parking
- Parking too close to an intersection
- Parking across driveways
- Parking too close to pedestrian crossings

Common Traffic Signs

The City of Salisbury has implemented a comprehensive traffic management and parking scheme in the streets surrounding your child's school to help make it a safe place.

Going against the road rules places not only your child's life at risk, but those of others. Tragedies can occur if care is not taken to abide by these rules. Below are some explanations of signs that are placed around schools to ensure your child stays safe.



No Parking Signs

Drop off and pick up only. You must not queue or wait here. The driver must remain with the vehicle.



No Parking Signs

The same rules apply as the previous 'No Parking' sign, however, the rules only apply during the times and days shown on the sign.



No Stopping Signs

You must not stop in a 'No Stopping' area at any time. Drop off and pick up is not allowed even for the briefest.



Yellow Kerb Lines

An unbroken yellow kerb line is a no stopping line and therefore the same rules apply as for a 'No Stopping' sign.



Bus Zone Signs

You must not stop within a bus zone at any time. This zone is only available to public buses.



Obstruct Driveways

A vehicle must not obstruct an entrance way or crossing point to a property, even if it is your own.

Reserves, Footpaths & Verges

It is an offence to drive or park on a reserve, footpath or dividing strip and could cause an accident, injure a pedestrian or damage property.




